Grange Furniture

Grange's Vintage collection sure looks the part—time-tested shapes with unexpected details, layers of hand-applied stain and lacquer for patina, and the same careful construction that was employed when Joseph Grange founded his shop in 1904. These overnight heirlooms are crafted by artisan cabinetmakers in the Monts du Lyonnais, France, incorporating such old-world techniques as dovetail jointing. Their curvaceous, feminine shapes take cues from 17th-century châteaux furniture created by masters André-Charles Boulle and Jean-François Oeben, or from pieces in historic Provence homes. But Grange has subtly updated them, replacing don't-touch period formality with modern warmth and practicality. The five-foot-high cherrywood corner cabinet shown here, for instance, has three adjustable shelves, making it as versatile as it is handsome. It's available in a distinctive midnight blue-and-gold diamond pattern or any of 42 solid-color finishes, from salmon to seafoam to luminous antiqued wood tones that let the quality speak for itself. —ANN ABEL
